Baylor College of Medicine's Graduate School of Biomedical Sciences is ranked highest among Texas biomedical graduate programs and BCM is ranked second in the United States in funding for research in the basic biomedical sciences.



Baylor College of Medicine's Human Genome Sequencing Center heralded a new era of personalized medicine as one of three National Institutes of Health (NIH)-funded genome centers that mapped the entire human genome.



Overall enrollment in BCM's Graduate School of Biomedical Sciences has increased 20 percent since 2003 and the average time from enrollment to degree completion is 5.9 years, as compared to the national average of seven years.



Baylor College of Medicine is the only National Institutes of Health (NIH) Diabetes Center in Texas and one of only 17 in the United States. As a member of this network, BCM will collaborate with centers across the country and act as a national resource on diabetes and diabetes research.
